At the heart of this project lies a necessity to redefine and re-examine the concept 'ghetto' in the context of today's closed migrant districts. Through artistic creation and sociological research, we aim to create a space in which to examine and discuss the multiple stories emanating from migrant 'ghettos' of Europe. How do we talk about 'ghettos' today? Is it possible – and even necessary – to redefine the word in a manner that more accurately reflects the multiform realities that constitute our contemporary urban landscapes? What role do 'ghettos' play in constructing a European identity? What factors contribute to phenomena of 'ghettoization' in contemporary Europe? What are the dynamics that contribute to the implantation of migrant communities throughout Europe today and how do they connect to the collective memory of Europe's past?

The City Ghetτος of Today entails a series of workshops open to local communities in different European cities – Warsaw, Paris, Bologna, Milan, Helsinki, Berlin and Antwerp. Run by artists and cultural actors, each workshop installment will conclude with an art installation and public debate on the project's themes in each of the cities listed above. This European collaboration will conclude in Warsaw in January 2015 with a large-scale installation-performance and debate that will bring together materials culled from each of the participating city workshops. The project unites artists, cultural actors, academics and social workers in order to explore the broad themes of 'ghetto' and 'districts of migration' in participating European cities. *The City Ghetτος of Today* reflects the interdisciplinary dimension of the Strefa WolnoSłowa foundation, which crosses academic and theoretical methodologies with practices of artistic and cultural creation. Through artistic reflection and intellectual research, this collaborative project seeks to unravel the complex and problematical theme of 'migrant ghettos' in contemporary Europe, paying particular attention to various definitions and visions of ghettos within the contexts of Warsaw, Paris, Bologna, Helsinki, Milan, Berlin and Antwerp.

Antwerp is a city of 'super-diversity'. With new migrants arriving daily, many of the city's neighbourhoods have become 'welcome districts' for these groups. These areas have also attracted young Belgian families and cultural organisations, largely due to the affordability of local housing and the cosmopolitan appeal of such diverse urban neighbourhoods. Under Sail uses the stories and experiences of newcomers and inhabitants of these districts to examine the concept of ghettos. Are these areas 'ghettos of today' or are they something completely different?

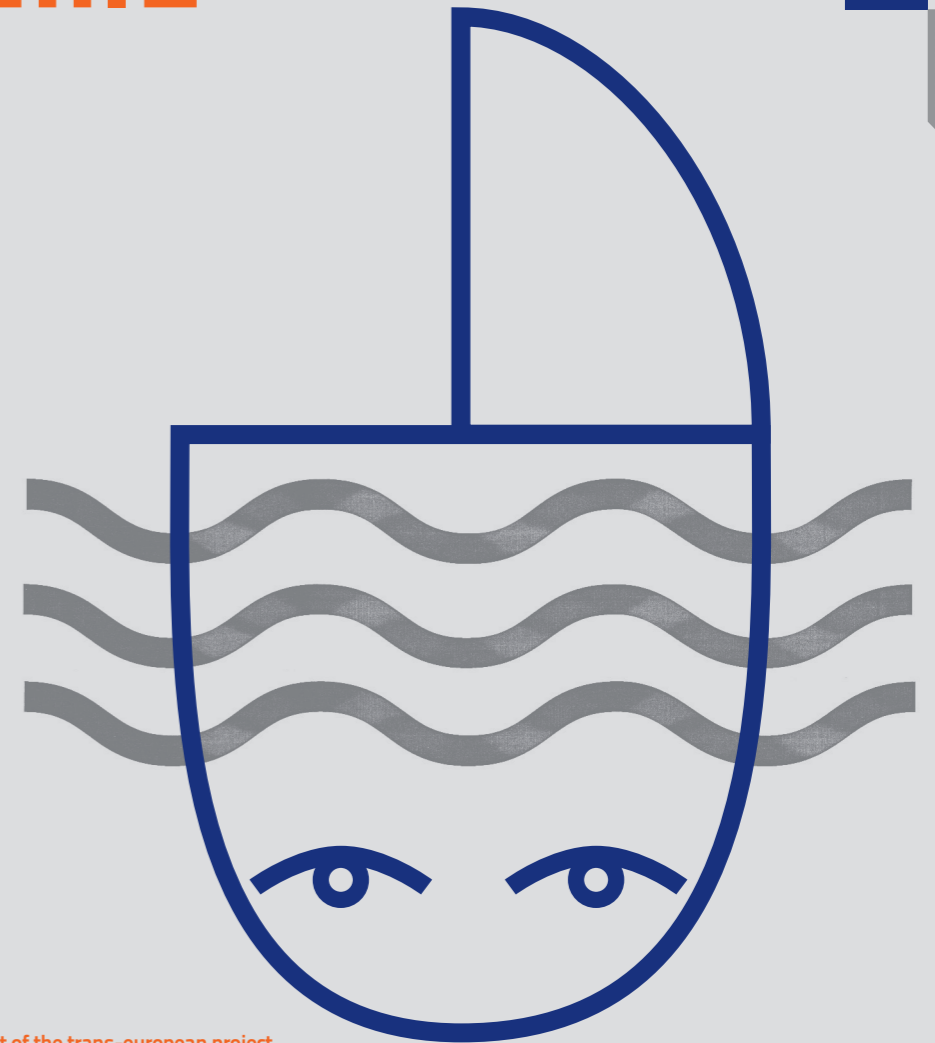

KunstZ will host The City Ghettos of Today's residency in Antwerp. kunstZ is a community art organisation focused on employing, engaging and training Antwerp's minority groups in order to facilitate their professional insertion into the city's cultural landscape. The organisation produces performances in collaboration with their minority partners and is equally a platform for employment in Antwerp and Flanders. kunstZ also runs a theatre-training program for immigrants and foreign-speaking newcomers, the students of which will participate in The City Ghettos of Today project.

While the other cities focused on specific characters from 'The Tempest' (Caliban's voices, Prosperos' veils, Miranda gazes upon the sea, The island is full of noises, Uninhabited island, The Caliban's cave) the Antwerp residency will explore the notion of 'homecoming', focusing specifically on the return voyage of The Tempest's island habitants back home.

The artistic team and the students of the kunstZ Academy will look forward into the future... What are the needs and dreams of this mixed company? How do they keep the ship sailing? How does the crew cooperate to balance the ship on rough seas?
